Centre-Assessed Grades for Key Stage 4 Qualifications this Summer

We would like to remind you that the mock examination series will run from 4th-14th May 2021.

We feel it is important to reinforce that although the mock examination series finishes by 14th May all students must continue to attend their lessons up until their leaving date of 28th May. This is because evidence will be considered by teachers, regarding your child's performance, up until their last day. It is important to remember that they will be continuing important coursework throughout this entire period of time. Ofqual have instructed schools not to share their Centre Assessed Grades with students and families. These will be provided on results day on the morning of 12th August 2021. Timings and more specific details about leavers' day will follow in the coming weeks.

Please also be aware that if your child does a subject that has a coursework element they may be expected to attend to complete aspects of this after the leaving date above and we will correspond directly with you if this affects your child.

Leavers Arrangements

Due to the ease in lockdown measures, we are pleased to be able to offer leavers' events for the year group. This includes a leavers' day and a prom, details of which are below. Please be aware, however, that this is a privilege and not a right. If your child is consistently disruptive or continually flouts the school rules, they will receive strikes which could threaten their eligibility to attend these events. Dangerous behaviour could result in an automatic ban. Please see below information regarding Year 11 uniform, Leavers' Day and Prom.


Prom

CAG for KS4 Qualification Reminder

As you'll know, external examinations are cancelled for all GCSEs and other qualifications this summer. Students will still receive a grade for each subject they study, however. This section aims to explain the system for awarding grades to be followed at Axe Valley. This will apply for all Year 11 students for all their qualifications.

- The school will determine the grades for all Year 11 courses this year.
- We will use evidence of your child's performance throughout their courses. If, due to school closures, they didn't finish learning the subject content (the specification), they won't be judged on content they didn't cover.
- We will consider your child's performance on all learning in school and remote learning.
- We have had one set of mock exams; there will be another set of mock exams starting on May 4th. These will be formal assessments in the hall, like their last set of mocks exams.
- Although we will consider performance in lessons, on remote learning tasks and homework, mock exams will provide us with very strong data to make fair and accurate judgements of your child's grades. As a result, the forthcoming mock exams are an important time for students as they will have a strong influence on their final grade. As noted above, they won't be tested or judged on material they haven't covered but will be tested on anything they've learned in each subject since the start of Year 9, when their Key Stage 4 courses began.
- Speaking endorsements in English Language, French and German go ahead as already planned.
- Subjects that use non-exam assessment (coursework) will judge student grades based on their coursework, or portfolios in Art and Photography. Where coursework hasn't been completed due to no fault of the student, they will be graded based on what they have done.
- Our deadline for submitting grades to your child's exam boards is June 18th; the work they do up to that date can influence the grade we assign.
- Results day will be 12th August
